Notice is hereby given that the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Department of the Interior has released an Environmental Assessment (EA) dated January 2024 for the proposed Colville Tribes Travel Plaza and Commercial Fee-To-Trust Project. The EA has been prepared pursuant to the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act, the Council on Environmental Quality Guidelines for Implementing NEPA (40 CFR Parts 1500-1508), and the BIA NEPA guidebook and assesses the environmental impacts that could result from the acquisition by the BIA of a 34-acre property (Project Site) into federal trust status for the benefit of the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation (Tribes), and the subsequent development by the Tribes of a travel plaza, retail and/or office building, and associated parking and infrastructure.

The Project Site consists of three parcels owned in fee by the Tribes (Assessor Parcel Numbers 113-220-073, 113-220-077, and 113-220-079), located east of U.S. Highway 395, in the City of Pasco in Franklin County, Washington. The Project Site is located in Section 17 of Township 9 North, Range 30 East as depicted on the Glade, WA U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5' quadrangle maps.

The public comment period for the EA will be open for 30 days, beginning on Wednesday, January 31, 2024 and ending on Friday, March 1, 2024.
